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## Anosmia in COVID-19

Anosmia, or the partial to total loss of smell, is familiar to anyone who's suffered a head cold. However, the symptom can also be caused by smoking, injury or infection. Clinicians have identified a significant number of cases of anosmia associated with the current COVID-19 outbreak, with unclear long-term outcomes. Further investigation into the link between anosmia and COVID-19 could improve identification and testing.
