## **Enterovirus D68**

Enterovirus D68 is one of many non-polio enteroviruses that can cause mild to severe respiratory illness. Symptoms may include fever, runny nose, sneezing, cough, body and muscle aches, and in more severe cases, wheezing and difficulty breathing. Infants, children, and teenagers are more likely to get infected with enteroviruses and become ill, yet adults can be affected as well. Enterovirus D68 is a possible cause of acute, unexplained severe respiratory illness, even in the absence of fever.
