### Are you looking for a specific book?

1. Go to the library website and click "Find Books".
2. Enter the title and click "Search".
3. If the library has the book, you will see a hyperlink. Click on this link to open the book in your browser.



### Browse collections of books

The library purchases collections of books on several different platforms, including:

**AccesMedicine:** texts such as *Harrison's Principles of Internal Medicine* and the popular *Current Medical Diagnosis & Treatment* series

**ClinicalKey:** texts that include many medical specialties

**EBSCO Nursing Collection:** books in nursing and allied health, including certification study guides

**R2 Digital Library:** books in the health sciences and nursing, including the *AACN Procedure Manual* and certification study guides

**Stat!Ref:** books in medicine and nursing, including Oxford textbooks, certification study guides and more
